

Our budget planning cycle began in August and a draft budget will be presented to the Membership in December. In past years, only a couple of Members outside of Committee and the Board Members have attended this meeting. I encourage you to pay attention to how your assessment is being allocated, participate in this meeting and ask questions. Every year I look at each line of accounting and it bothers me that the Association collects almost \$80,000 from service fees and late fees. The service fee provides the option to pay a monthly assessment whereas the late fee encourages homeowners to pay obligations on time. Your option to pay the annual assessment monthly costs you an additional \$20 per year. It will cost you an additional \$35 a month every time your payment is late. You can see how these fees add up quickly in a community with 3,857 lots. I encourage you to pay your annual assessment in one lump sum each year to avoid these costs.

Montclairions and government representatives gathered at Henderson Elementary School last month to discuss traffic calming measures VDOT will support. One item is a pole mounted speed display (PMSD) used on road sections where the average daily speed is 5 MPH over the speed limit. The hill heading toward Fallstone Place from the direction of Henderson Elementary qualified. VDOT approved the PMSD, set aside funding, and will install it with approval from the MPOA board. The board will vote on the PMSD this month. A special thank you to Nicole Wilberg and other Montclairions who continue pressing VDOT to act. It has been a long process, but well worth the effort.


Pam most recently worked at with NFC Amenity

Manager's Message

Hi Montclairions:

Many times each week, we are asked the following questions:

- "What is the purpose of the association?"
- "Why do I pay assessments?"
- "Why do I have to follow the rules?"

These are all excellent questions and the answers are something every resident is entitled to (and should) know. Please allow me a moment to provide some clarity regarding the wonderful world of association living!

Associations were created to alleviate financial obligations for upkeep and maintenance of non-privately held property. You can see this most clearly by comparing the medians mowed by associations to those maintained once or twice a year by VDOT. Association assessments are like real estate property taxes, which you pay to the County, but in this case the fees go directly to your community and are used to support and maintain everything within the property boundaries which are not privately owned.

In a nutshell, the primary purpose of an association is to ensure that your community looks its best and the amenities function smoothly. The primary way to do this is by creating a budget and collecting assessments. It sounds simple doesn't it? Let's expand this theory a little!

Associations are considered "not-for-profit" meaning assessments are set to cover expected expenses and ensure the reserves are funded (we'll get to the reserves in a minute!). Each fall, the Budget and Finance Committee painstakingly scrutinize each expense and committee budget request along with income in order to prepare a draft budget for Board consideration at their December meeting. It's a challenging task with so many opinions – and we're so thankful for their dedication!

The expenses are split into several categories, such as: contracts, insurance, management, utilities. The largest expense item for any community is typically the funds set aside for future repair and replacement of amenities and infrastructure. The "reserve" expenses for Montclair include things such as replenishment of the sand at the beaches, the dredging of the lake, repair or replacement of the tot lot components, maintenance of the building and other structures, asphalt milling and paving of common area streets, etc. Funds are set aside each year to ensure that when the time comes, we have the money available to pay for the work needed.

Once a budget is approved, the budget is presented for approval at the Annual Meeting in March. I've been asked before what happens if a budget is not passed. In that case, you simply continue using the previous year's budget, which means important new funding may not be allocated!

The assessments are the primary funding source of the expenses. Every unit's owner(s) is/are billed assessments and it's important to pay them on time or a late fee will incur. Assessments not paid in a timely manner are turned over to legal counsel for the purpose of collecting the debt. This is a very expensive process which must be paid for out of the budget and collected later from the delinquent owner. This obligation is tied to the purchase of all properties located within the association boundaries.

So, what other obligations come with a home purchase? Associations have restrictive covenants which are used to maintain the attractiveness and value of the property. Some rules are set in stone and some may be changed from time to time in keeping with the needs of the community. For Montclarions, it's important to review Article 5 Architectural Guidelines and Home Businesses every so often to ensure you are well-informed of the rules relating to your specific property. There are many other detailed records relating to the association which are helpful to owners; I encourage you to be a student of your governing documents. The reference materials are available on the website or you can simply call the office at 703-670-6787 to ask your question. We're happy to help!

Montclair's Upcoming Annual Meeting on March 14, 2020 and a Call for Candidates

Montclair's Annual Meeting is only a few months away. During the Annual Meeting, Montclairions will vote on the annual budget and elect four at-large Board representatives for a three-year term to represent the community. Member participation is vital and we're counting on all members to be informed and to cast their votes to make their voices heard.

Though we depend on our voters, we also depend on our candidates. If you have ever considered running for the Board before, perhaps now is the time to devote more thought to the matter. Being a Board member is a very rewarding experience but can be a significant time commitment and will present some challenges. Please consider the following before you decide on the matter.

Do I have time?

As a Board member, you will be required to devote several hours of your time each month to Association business. Board meetings and Committee meetings are held monthly; and on occasion there are special meetings to attend as well. You may be called upon to research a project or prepare communications about a topic or anything else that might be needed at the time.

Do I have a special skill that would benefit the community? Are you an accountant? Have you dealt regularly with

contracts and vendors? Do you have amazing communication and editing skills? Are you a tech whiz? We need all skills and experiences to make an effective and excellent team.

Can I make a tough decision?

The primary role of the Board is to conduct the business of the Association. This can mean anything from approving budgets to analyzing vendor quotes to enforcing MPOA policies – and everything in between! Board members are required to step beyond their comfort zones and outside their sphere of influence to make the best decisions for the good of the entire community.

Can I do all of this and still have fun?

Maintaining a sense of community is a large part of a Board member's responsibilities. Planning and attending community events and being a positive presence in Montclair are just as important as any policy decision.

There's no doubt it's a challenging role but knowing the impact you're making on our community will be worth it. If you think you're up for the task, please reference the Board of Directors Call for Candidate found inside this issue of *The Montclairion* or online at Montclairva.com under "For Residents" and then click on "Forms and Docs." Clean Boats, Clean Waters

Boating is one of the most popular recreational activities in the Montclair community. Invasive organisms that are introduced through water recreation activities disrupt the ecosystem, interfere with recreation and damage watercraft and equipment. Our Montclair boating family plays a crucial role in the prevention of the spread of Aquatic Invasive Species (AIS).

Here are a few simple steps to take so we can continue to enjoy boating for years to come.

- Take a local boating class to learn how to inspect your boat, trailers and gear; this will arm you with information about inspecting boat hulls, live wells, props and other equipment for invasive species and to describe what to do if any are found.
- Inspect and remove any visible mud, plants, fish or animals before transporting your recreational equipment.
- Drain water from equipment (boat, motor, trailer, live wells) before transporting it.
- Wipe with a towel and air-dry equipment for at least five days.
- Dispose of unwanted live bait in the trash.
- It is also important to know Virginia laws pertaining to boating.

Clean Boats, Clean Waters Inspection Program is an opportunity to take a front line defense against the spread of aquatic invasive species in our community lake. Will you be a Montclair Boating Hero? Help us fight the spread of AIS!

COVENANTS UPDATE by Armin Neuman, MPOA Covenants Manager

As you move-in, move-out or maybe just declutter, please keep in mind the following rules and regulations regarding Yard Sales/Garage Sales in Montclair.

Per Section 5.4.18 of the MPOA Guidelines: "Garage sales and yard sales are restricted to the confines of that owner's lot. A shared driveway or pipe-stem may not be used to conduct a yard/garage sale unless written consent has been obtained from all neighboring property owners who utilize that driveway or pipe-stem. A homeowner may conduct a garage sale or a yard sale up to four times per 12-month period. Homeowners must follow all MPOA signage guidelines when advertising the garage/yard sale."

Homeowners must also follow all MPOA signage guidelines when advertising the garage/yard sale.

Per Section 5.4.43 (f) of the MPOA Guidelines: "Yard/garage sale signs are permitted for Montclair residents only. They may be posted on the day of the sale. Yard/garage sale signs may not be nailed, glued, or stapled to the road, street, or directional signs in Montclair. All signs shall be removed at the end of the day of the yard/garage sale." Please note, if not removed at the end of the day of the yard/garage sale, signage will be discarded immediately by MPOA staff.

What's on Your Ballot?

If you're reading this article before 7 p.m. on Tuesday, November 5, 2019, you still have time to vote! But where do you go to vote? How do you know if you're even registered to vote or exactly what's on the ballot?

You can use the Virginia elections website to find information about your voter registration, polling place, candidates you'll be voting for or the districts in which you vote. (https://vote. elections.virginia.gov/VoterInformation) Depending on where you live in Montclair, your Virginia House of Delegates is either in District 31 or District 52.

Finding out what's on your ballot is not as simple as visiting a website or receiving a voter's guide in the mail. The Prince William County Office of Elections recently mailed a voter information guide with a sample ballot, but it includes the candidates for all of Prince William County. In this article, we've included a list of the candidates that you'll see on your ballot if you're registered to vote with a Montclair address.

For Montclair residents, this November's general election will only include two local bond questions and candidates for state-and county-level positions. (Note: List of candidates retrieved September 27, 2019 from https://www.elections.virginia.gov/casting-a-ballot/candidate-list/) The official ballot will not reflect party affiliations for candidates for Commonwealth's Attorney, Board of County Supervisors, School Board and Soil and Water Conversation Director.

In addition to voting for candidates, you will be voting on two questions about local bonds: (1) Mobility/ Road Improvement Bonds and (2) Park Improvement Bonds – Outdoor Facilities.



Polling places are open from 6 a.m. to 7 p.m. on Tuesday, November 5, 2019 for the general election. As long as you're in line by 7 p.m., you'll be allowed to vote.



I hope everyone has had a chance to enjoy the beautiful fall weather. I have been busy working with my legislative team over the summer listening to your needs and making myself available for your service. Please do not hesitate to contact my office via phone at 571-403-1213 or at DeleGuzman@House.Virginia.Gov.

This past month, I attended several back to school nights and I want to use this opportunity to wish all students a successful school year. I also hosted an Environmental Town Hall in Warrenton that was well attended by residents of the 31st District living in Fauquier and Prince William Counties. We were joined by the Virginia Department Elizabeth Guzman of Conservation and Recreation, Piedmont Environmental Council, Delegate Climate Action Network and Virginia League of Conservation Voters. Everyone in attendance agreed that climate is a pressing issue and protecting the environment should be a priority for all levels of government. Preserving the environment is vital so the next generation will be able to enjoy the Commonwealth as we do today, so that is why it is one of my top priorities. We must hold corporate polluters accountable as we did to protect Possum Point in Dumfries, Virginia.

On October 9th the Prince William County Department of Transportation in partnership with the Virginia Department of Transportation came to Henderson Elementary School to report back the speed and congestion data they collected on Waterway Dr. over the summer and early fall. They have made available to us the data and proposed plans that are being reviewed by county stakeholders. The proposals and data set may be accessed online at: http://bit.ly/WaterwaySilvanGlen.

I believe that these are steps in the right direction, but much more is needed to improve the safety along Waterway Drive. Gift Cards are Not Payments

Gift cards are a great way to give a gift! But did you know they are also a scammer's favorite way to steal money?

Gift cards are for gifts, not for making payments. If someone calls with urgent news or a convincing story and then pressures you to pay them by buying a gift card, like an iTunes or Google Play card, and then giving them the codes on the back of the card – stop. It's a scam

Gift cards are the number one payment method that imposters demand. Scammers will say anything to get your money and they know how to play into your fears, hopes, or sympathies. They like gift cards because, once they've got the code on the back, the money is gone and almost impossible to trace. But knowing how these scams work can help you avoid them, and you can help even more by passing on the information to people you know.

If you paid a scammer with a gift card, report it as soon as possible. Tell the FTC about it – or any other scam – at ftc.gov/complaint.

Montclair History

Did you know?

What remains of Minnieville is a single room church at the corner of Minnieville Road and Cardinal Drive: Greenwood Primitive Baptist Church. In the mid-1900s, the little church was bricked, the tin roof was replaced and new windows were put in. Today, the little church still stands with no frills, no steeple, no stained glass and no carpet. Until recently, the church hosted a worship service once a month and an Annual Meeting in October. The little church has a cemetery with headstones bearing the names of many of the original landowners and farmers in this area in the 19th and 20th centuries. For example, Emma Jane Alexander was appointed postmistress to Minnieville Post office on May 16, 1903 and held that position until her death in 1924. She is buried at the cemetery here. The large maples that surround the church provide shade for curious visitors interested in local history.
